# Korea

 Four organizations of Korea were elected as Board of Governor of World Water Council to be held in October, 2009.(59 members at the present)

 1) Korea Water Forum 2) Ministry of Land, Transport and Maritime Affairs  
3) Korea Water Resources Corporation 4) Korea Water Resources Association

 Former Prime Minister , also for Former President of Korea Water Forum

# China

 By signing MOU with the World Water Council, China joined in the WWC as a member state. Afterwards, there are eight other organizations from China join in the WWC as its members, and the Ministry of Water Resources was elected as a member of the board of the WWC.





 The Chinese Government carries out the strictest water resources management system. The three red lines identify water resources development, waste water treatment of water function zones and water efficiency control in order to promote sustainable development of economy and society.

 For climate change adaptation, the Chinese Government issued the objective of reducing carbon emission. The carbon dioxide emission per unit of GDP is managed to decrease 40%-45% by 2020 in comparison with that in 2005.

 There are a set of international activities taken place in China, like the 3<sup>rd</sup> Yangtze Forum, the 4<sup>th</sup> Yellow River International Forum and the 13<sup>th</sup> World Lake Conference, to convene professionals and experts in the world to discuss about hot issues and challenges of water resources management.




# Japan


-  **Establishment of the Water Security Council of Japan (WSCJ) in January 2009**
  - **Team Water Japan for Global Water Security –**
-  **Now, 26 Action teams are composed including Governmental authorities, private sectors, CSOs with the theme such as “Expansion of Water Reuse”**
-  **Two organizations were elected as Board of Governors of WWC .**
  - 1) **Japan Water Forum** 2) **CTI Engineering Co., Ltd**
-  **School Water Supply and Sanitation Promotion Projects in the Philippines and Sri Lanka completed and is under the progress in Peru.**



# Mongolia

 By 2004, 66% of the Mongolian population received water from a piped water supply system. The remaining 34% was provided from non-piped water supply systems including 24% by water delivery trucks and 9% from natural springs, ponds, snow and rivers.

 The Government included the establishment of large river basin councils in the law of water, which was adopted in 2004, especially for the purpose of sustainable water supply.

 is under the process to prepare for the Mongolian Water Forum linked with various stakeholders.
