- Over 25,000 participants
- 192 countries represented
- 1,300 participants in the political processes
- 106 sessions prepared by over 400 organizations
- 150 side events
- Over 1,000 accredited journalists
- 135 children from over 20 countries and over 200 youth participants
- 1,000 sponsored participants

- ✓ A strong will to federate all stakeholders and encourage action






Examples of possible solutions:

- 1,000 cities sign the Istanbul Water Consensus


PROMOTION AND EVENTS COMMISSION

- Local organization and logistics: exhibition and meeting places, hotels, boats, urban transportation, registration...
- Promotion at different levels: local, national and international to inform, raise awareness, mobilize and promote through a strong outreach programme
- Create events: 100 actions in different fields: education, culture, youth, sport, economy through exhibitions, movies, concerts, conferences, theatre...
- Three major concerns:
- Highlight the work of the other commissions (Interaction with regional, political and thematic processes)
- ✓ Associate local autorities through a local committee
- Organize a popular process for a Forum of Citizens







Proposed organisation for SMART and WISE regional Targets



REGIONAL PROCESS

KEY CARACTERISTICS AND OBJECTIVES (COMMON REQUIREMENTS)



- Asia Pacific Water Forum for Asia Pacific Region
- Structured around regional Targets
 - 5 10 multi-stakeholder Target processes per region
 - Targets from Thematic process or region-specific

Open and participative

- 1 Target Coordinator by Target, chosen through open Call for Proposals
- Encouraging participation from all organisations, including smaller ones and "out of the water box"

Financial support from WWF

 But co-financing required from major regional stakeholders









NEXT STEPS FOR **Asia-Pacific** REGIONAL PROCESS



- Consortium-based approach
- Propose 5 10 regional Targets
- Participate to 2nd stakeholder meeting in Paris, January 17-18th
 - Coordinate with other processes
 - Endorse regional Targets
 - Define Terms of Reference for Target CfPs
- Run Calls for proposals
 - January/February 2011
 - Have Target processes up and running for the next World Water Day (March 22nd, 2011)












